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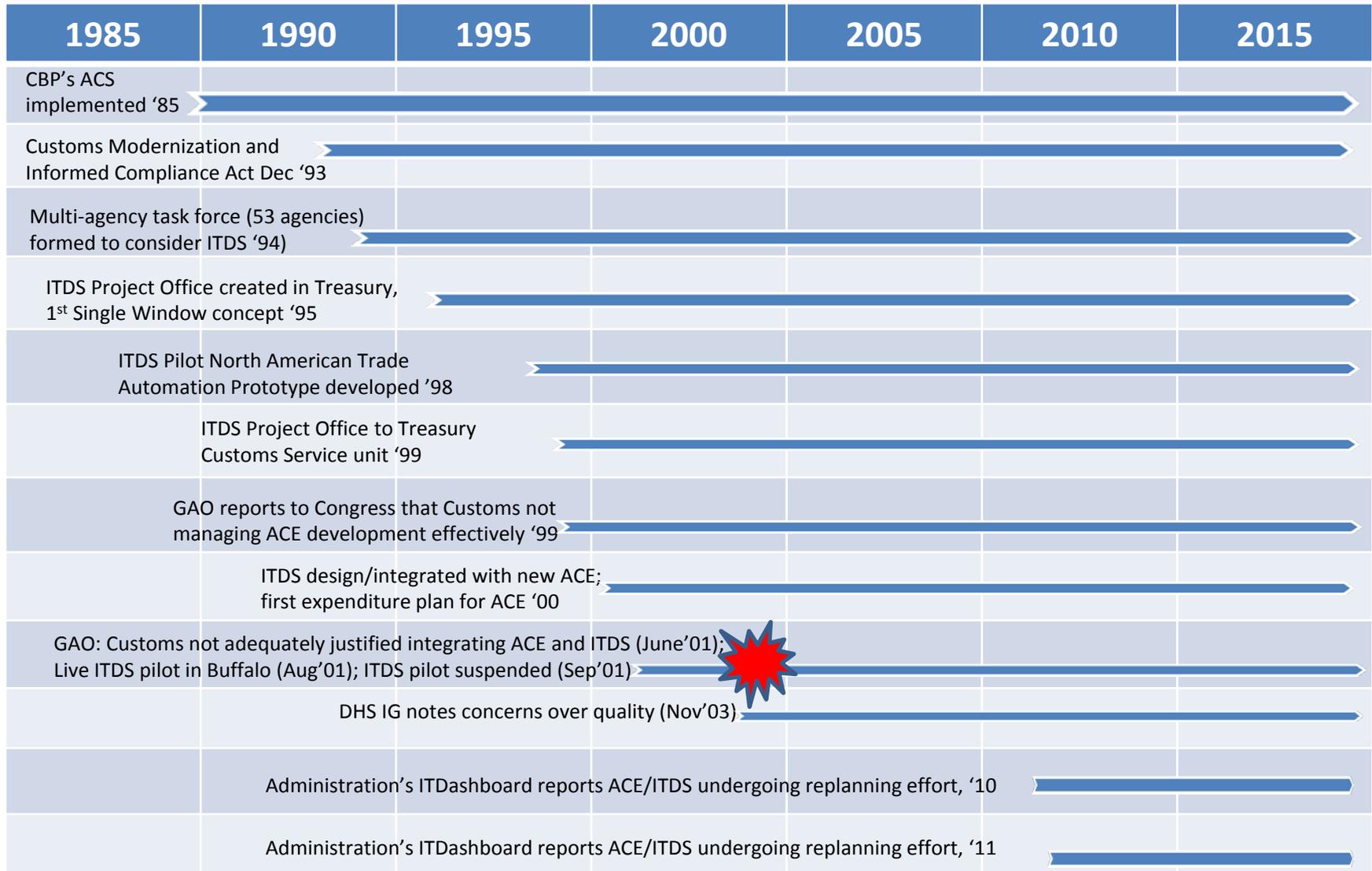


Goals of ITDS

- Modernize border operations
- Reduce dependence on paper forms
 - Provide information for targeting
 - Facilitate authorized sharing of information
- Reduce burden by creating “Single Window”
- Reduce redundancy among agency data collections
 - 47 agencies participating

Recent Developments

- CBP/DHS
 - Established more stable priorities for project
 - Switched to Agile approach to speed development
 - Issued draft deployment plan with goal of completing core functionality by July 2016



Oversight

- March 2011 – President’s Export Council letter urged timely development of Single Window
- March 2013 – National Security Staff formed ITDS Task Force to drive project to completion
 - Identified issues impeding project
 - NSS Staff working with agencies to resolve
 - Establishing high level milestones



Milestone Goals

- April 5, 2014 – 1st release of ACE Exports
- May 2015 – Mandated use of e-Manifest
 - Imports and Exports
- November 2015 – Mandated use of Cargo Release
 - Includes PGA interactions
- October 2016 – Mandatory use of ACE
