

Automated Commercial Environment ACE WILL BECOME THE SINGLE WINDOW

CBP is working to complete and deploy core trade processing capabilities in ACE by **December 2016**, a timeline supported by Executive Order 13659, *Streamlining the Import/Export Process for America's Businesses*, issued on February 19, 2014. To determine any impacts to your business, please review the information on the following pages to understand upcoming changes and how to prepare.



As part of the implementation of the Single Window via ACE, mandatory dates have been established requiring trade users to file electronic data through ACE in lieu of legacy systems. With these dates approaching quickly, it is critical for members throughout the trade community to fully transition to ACE as soon as possible to ensure readiness well in advance of the updated mandatory dates.

Mandatory use of ACE for all electronic manifest filings

2016

28 FEBRUARY
2016

CBP will start divesting legacy ACS, by:

- Offering limited Client Representative and Technology Service Desk (TSD) support to the trade for ACS entry/entry summary types that are available in ACE.
- Performing ACS maintenance during peak business hours.
- Providing processing priority to ACE entries where corresponding ACS entries are still available.

28 MAY
2016

In addition to the March 31 requirements, filers will be required to file in ACE, and no longer permitted to file in ACS, the following transactions:

- Electronic entries, associated with the following entry types, without PGA data (except those with APHIS Lacey Act and NHTSA data):

01—Consumption; 03—Consumption-Antidumping/Countervailing Duty; 11—Informal; 23—Temporary Importation Bond (TIB); 51—Defense Contract Administration Service Region (DCASR); and, 52—Government-Dutiable

- Electronic entries and corresponding entry summaries for the following transactions:

Entry Type 06—Consumption Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) without PGA data other than APHIS Lacey Act or NHTSA, unless paired with other PGA data on the same transaction

NLT 2016

Mandatory use of ACE for all remaining electronic portions of the CBP cargo process, including:

- Drawback
- Protest
- Reconciliation
- Statements

31 MARCH
2016

Filers will be required to file in ACE and no longer permitted to file in ACS the following transactions:

- Electronic entry summaries, associated with the following entry types, without PGA data.

01—Consumption; 03—Consumption-Antidumping/Countervailing Duty; 11—Informal; 23—Temporary Importation Bond (TIB); 51—Defense Contract Administration Service Region (DCASR); and, 52—Government-Dutiable

- Electronic entries and corresponding entry summaries, associated with the entry types above, with data for the following agencies:

- Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) for Lacey Act, unless paired with other Partner Government Agency (PGA) data on the same transaction
- National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), unless paired with other PGA data on the same transaction

SUMMER
2016

In addition to the March 31 and May 28 requirements, filers will be required to file in ACE, and no longer permitted to file in ACS, the following transactions:

- Electronic entries & corresponding entry summaries, associated with the following entry types, without PGA data (except APHIS Lacey Act or NHTSA) will be deployed to users, and must be filed, in ACE:

- Entry and Entry Summaries for entry types 02—Consumption-Quota/Visa; 07—Consumption-Antidumping/Countervailing Duty & Quota/Visa Combination; 12—Informal-Quota/Visa (other than textiles); 21—Warehouse; and, 22—Re-Warehouse
- Entry Summaries for entry types 31—Warehouse Withdrawal Consumption; 32—Warehouse Withdrawal-Quota; 34—Warehouse Withdrawal Antidumping/Countervailing Duty; and, 38—Warehouse Withdrawal-Antidumping/Countervailing Duty & Quota/Visa Combination

- Throughout summer 2016, the following agencies will provide—if they have not done so already—functionality for filing electronically in ACE:

AMS; ATF; APHIS Core; CDC; CPSC; DCMA; DDTC; DEA; E&C; EPA; FDA; FWS; FSIS; FAS; NMFS; NRC; OMC; OTEXA; TTB; and USTR.
