Stephen Morrissey is vice president of regulatory and policy for United. In this role, he leads a team of dedicated professionals that advocate for United's interests before regulatory agencies in the United States and around United's world-leading international route network.

Previously, Mr. Morrissey served in senior regulatory and governmental affairs functions at United. Most recently, he was managing director, regulatory and policy. Before assuming that role, he was managing director, governmental affairs where he was responsible for managing United's team of in-house and contract lobbyists in Washington, D.C., and also managing United's political action committee. He joined United in January, 2000.

Prior to joining United, Mr. Morrissey spent seven years in the Office of the Secretary, U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) during the Clinton Administration. He held various positions at DOT, including Special Counsel, where he served as a senior advisor to the General Counsel responsible for providing analysis and strategic guidance on legal issues and policy matters for the Department. Before moving to the General Counsel's office, Mr. Morrissey was a senior congressional relations officer specializing in aviation issues.

A native of Massachusetts, Mr. Morrissey worked as a district aide for former U.S. Representative Chester G. Atkins before moving to Washington. He also worked as a political aide to Massachusetts Governor Michael Dukakis and Attorney General James Shannon. He was active in a number of Massachusetts and national political campaigns.

Mr. Morrissey holds a law degree from the Columbus School of Law at the Catholic University of America and a bachelor's degree from Saint Anselm College in Manchester, NH. He is a member of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Bar and the Bar of the Supreme Court of the United States. He is married with two children and resides in Arlington, VA.
