SUBJECT: Public Comment on Commercial Availability Request Under the U.S. - Morocco FTA

Dear Mr. Teitelbaum:

We are in receipt of the Federal Register Notice announcing a comment period on a petition from Swimsuit Commission Corporation (SCC) requesting revision to the rules of origin for certain women's and girls' swimwear to address availability of supply of certain printed and piece-dyed warp knit fabrics of polyester or nylon fibers under the United States – Morocco Free Trade Agreement.

Please be advised that McMurray Fabrics, Inc. is a leading domestic supplier of warp knit fabrics of polyester and nylon with spandex and thus is strongly opposed to the SCC request. Our capabilities include fabrics meeting the following description contained in the SCC petition and summarized in the Federal Register Notice:

Printed and piece-dyed warp knit fabrics of polyester or nylon fibers classified in subheadings 6004.10 containing between 3% and 41% elastomeric yarns, in which the elastomeric yarns were engineered for chlorine resistance, for use in women's or girl's swimwear classified in subheading 6112.41.

We note that there appears to be a discrepancy in this description as 6004.10 which is defined in the U.S. Harmonized Tariff Schedule as containing by weight 5 percent or more of elastomeric yarn. Fabrics containing 3% or 4% elastomeric would be classified elsewhere in the tariff schedule. To clarify, we are capable of producing the full requested range of 3% - 41% elastomeric content.

McMurray Fabrics currently produces	square meters of fabric containing	spandex in our
U.S. facilities. We have capacity to produce an ac	dditional square meters	annually. These
fabrics are piece dyed or prepared for printing. E	Elastomeric yarns treated for chlorine	e resistance are
routinely used in our operations and are readily a	available for any new programs. Our	fabrics are suitable
for use in women's or girl's swimwear classified i	n subheading 6112.41. Further, thes	e fabrics can be
supplied in commercial quantities in a timely mai	nner.	

Please be aware that we have never been contacted by Swimsuit Commission Corporation, but we would be pleased to work with them to supply their fabric needs.
