Dear Ambassador Zoellick:

During negotiation of Chapters Ten (Investment) and Eleven (Cross-Border Trade in Services) of the Morocco-United States Free Trade Agreement, the United States expressed an interest in Morocco allowing any person, including a person who is not a physician, to establish private clinics and comparable medical facilities. The United States also expressed an interest in Morocco allowing any person, including a person who is not a pharmacist, to establish enterprises engaged in the manufacture or wholesale distribution of pharmaceutical products.

I have the honor to confirm that Morocco has taken note of the interests expressed by the United States and will take them into account as it reforms its laws governing the activities in question.
